Elected Chairman Danforth opened the Board of Selectmen's Meeting at 6:35 p.m.

2. Review and Approve Minutes of May June 16 & June 30, 2009

Selectman Bourbon moved to accept the Minutes of June 16, 2009, Selectman MacDougall seconded a motion. Vote, 3-0

Selectman Bourbon moved to approve the Minutes of the Special Town Meeting on June 30, 2009, Selectman MacDougall seconded a motion. Vote, 3-0

3. Public Input: No Public Input

4. Unfinished Business:

A. Dispatch: Discussion on Dispatch Services

Dwayne updated the Board of Selectmen on Dispatch Services.

Each Dispatch Center dispatches differently and will take time to adjust to the new dispatching procedures.

The voice communications in cars are coming in very clear. The receptions for portables are not as clear on the back side of the mountain, but are readable.

There are some problems with IMC connectivity with Sanford. The computer technicians are working on resolving this issue by June 8, 2009.

B. Ice Storm: Tree Debris Clean Up

The tree debris clean up is close to completion. There are approximately twelve trees that need to be taken down and a few brush piles that need to be picked up.

The tree debris clean up cost is under budget to date.

C. Roads: Update, Central York County Transportation Study

Selectman Drew asked about Pratt & Whitney sidewalk lines.

Dwayne explained that he has contacted the State about the side walk lines, but has not heard back from the State.

The Community Center base pavement has been completed.

Pike Industries would like to complete the paving of Canal Street, Mill Lane, Nowell Street and the Community Center at the same time. With weather permitting the paving would be done at the end of July or the beginning of August.

On July 8, 2009 the Town Crew will start to fill the canal which will take some time to complete.

The State wanted to do a transportation study of Gorham and Sanford and a more comprehensive study of the Gorham area and the Sanford area which the Town of North Berwick is a part of the study area.

Dwayne explained that the State passed a law two years ago in which they tied two studies together.

The Central York County Connection Study is gong to look inclusively at all the major highways in Central York County. The major routes are Route 111, Route 109, Route 9, part of Route 202; part of Route 4, Route 35 and Route 99. They have done independent studies on all those roads, but they haven't done a comprehensive study.

The Town's that are involved met for two hours and the State gave an outline of what they are going to do. The State will be hiring consultants to do a comprehensive study on traffic patterns and land use patterns around the roads and how it is going to look like in twenty years.

Dwayne explained what the State is going to look for from the Town's is a Cooperative Agreement between the State of Maine Department of Transportation and the Maine Turnpike Authority. The State has developed an outline on what they are looking to do and it breaks down preliminary roles and responsibilities.

The State would ask that we sign a Cooperative Agreement and assign a volunteer to be involved in the project.

Dwayne provided the Board of Selectmen with a draft of the Cooperative Agreement and an outline of Primary Roles and Responsibilities for Cities and Towns, Departments, Regional Planning Agencies and Authority.
