Notable Arrests of the Month

Officers arrested and charged 21 subjects in the month of March relating to a variety of different cases. Below are several of the standout arrests.

3.1.19 – Subject was arrested for operating under the influence and possession of heroin.

3.9.19 – Subject was charged with criminal speed on Valley Road; 70 MPH in a posted 40 MPH zone.

3.16.19 – Subject was arrested criminal speed (92 MPH in a 45 MPH zone), operating under the influence, and operating without a license.

3.22.19 – Subject was arrested on 2 counts of domestic violence assault, criminal mischief, as well as an additional count of assault for spitting on Officers.

3.23.19 – Subject was charged with operating under the influence after crashing into a house on High Street.

Other Monthly Stats of Note

- Officers conducted nearly 400 business and residential property checks.
- Officers initiated over 150 traffic stops for various violations.
