Motor Vehicle Registration Update

On March 27, 2020 Governor Janet Mills issued an Executive Order temporarily suspending the registration requirement for motor vehicles in regards to the Covid-19 Pandemic. This suspension allowed vehicle's to operate with an expired and, in some cases, no registration whatsoever. Governor Mills' Executive Order was accompanied with a request to Law Enforcement Officials to halt enforcement in regards to the registration requirement. As society begins to return to a sense of "normalcy" State and Municipal Governments have begun the re-opening process and the motor vehicle registration exception has been lifted. Vehicle owners have been notified to register their vehicles by July 11, 2020. Many Bureau of Motor Vehicles Offices have reopened – by appointment only – and the online Rapid Renewal system is functioning properly. The North Berwick Town Office has reopened with Covid-19 safety precautions in place. The North Berwick Police Department is reminding all vehicle owners to comply with the July 11, 2020 vehicle registration date.

Other meetings will be scheduled at later dates (every other month) and some of the topics that we plan on addressing are school safety, erratic operation and speeding vehicles, drug trends and issues, along with internet, phone, and mail scams. Our ultimate goal is to provide the best law enforcement services possible while representing the values that make the North Berwick Community a wonderful place to live and work.
